Have you always been interested in the fine art of taxidermy? Ever wonder how they do it, put an animal together after it has passed on? How is the smell taken out of a fish? How do the wings stay positioned on a bird in flight? How are the colors put back in a fish mount? All of these questions can be answered at Trails End School of Taxidermy, located in Rice, MN - 20 minutes North of St Cloud, MN on Hwy 10.

As a student at Trails End School of Taxidermy, you will gain hands-on instruction from some of the finest instructors the Midwest has to offer. Through demonstrations and discussion, you will learn the fundamentals needed to prepare you for developing a working knowledge of the art of taxidermy.

Trails End School of Taxidermy offers a variety of courses including; birds, small mammals, game heads, fish, scenery base design, and basic business instruction. Classes are held in the evening, three times per year, and run Monday through Friday for 12 weeks. Specialized courses are also offered at different times throughout the year. If the entire course is not what you are looking for, species specific classes are available. Day classes are also available, however, they are only held on the weekend. mammal, and 3 scenery bases. **ALL SPECIMENS ARE PROVIDED BY TRAILS END SCHOOL OF TAXIDERMISTRY.** Each mount is the students to take home with them at the completion of the course. For the experienced taxidermist, Trails End School of Taxidermy offers advanced, one week species specific intermediate courses.

Students will also receive instruction in basic business operations. Each student will leave with an understanding of how to set-up and run a shop. This includes; controlling overhead expenses, customer relations, basic bookkeeping, mount pricing, licensing, and various other day to day procedures.

If the entire course is not what the student is looking for, there is also the option of enrolling in individual courses. The tuition breakdown, and dates for these, is available by contacting Trails End School of Taxidermy.

Birds

35 hours are devoted to bird taxidermy. Students will skin and mount 3 birds, two pheasants and a duck (to be placed on a scenery base). The following procedures will be covered:

- Anatomy
- Skinning and fleshing
- Preserving
- Measurements
- Form selection
- Skin preparation
- Mounting
- Final preparation
- Painting with an airbrush
- Positioning on base/habitat

SCHOOL CALENDAR

Each student will mount; 3 birds, 3 gameheads, 6 fish, 1 life-size small

classes held in the fall. Each class is 12 weeks in length, Monday - Friday from 5:00 pm to 10:00 pm. The following is a list of dates that class is not in session:

FACILITIES

Trails End School of Taxidermy is located inside a fully equipped, working taxidermy shop. 1,800 square feet has been dedicated as classroom area. This includes eight individual student booths, paint booth, supply area, instructor demonstration area, walk-in freezer, and restroom.

HOUSING

Trails End School of Taxidermy does not have on-site housing at this time.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

Attendance is a crucial part of learning the art of taxidermy. If you're not in class, it is impossible to gain the knowledge needed to complete the course. If a student is not able to attend class due to health or emergency reasons, notice must be given as soon as possible. Without prior notice of an absence, the student will not be allowed to make-up that class. In the

event of two (2) consecutive absences without prior notification, or a total of five (5) throughout the course length, a student will be dismissed.

STUDENT CONDUCT

Students of Trails End School of Taxidermy are responsible for following all of the rules and regulations that have been set forth. Failure to follow any of the rules and regulations may result in immediate dismissal. The rules and regulations are as follows:

1. All safety regulations must be observed and followed.
2. Physical and/or verbal assault against any student or instructor will not be tolerated.
3. Theft or damage of any property will not be allowed.
4. Students must refrain from using obscene or vulgar language.
5. Harassment of any form will not be tolerated.
6. Students will not be allowed to come to class intoxicated or under the influence of any controlled substance.
7. Students will not be allowed to have in their possession any controlled or illegal substances.
8. Stealing or falsifying information will not be tolerated.
9. Students must respect other students and do nothing that may interfere with their learning.
10. Students will not be allowed to do or participate in any activity that could bring harm to themselves or any other student.

The rules set forth above have been created to provide a safe environment so that every student may have the opportunity to obtain a quality education. Trails End School of Taxidermy may, at any time it deems necessary, add to or edit any of the rules and regulations as it sees fit.

COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

If, at any time, a student would like to file a complaint in regards to another student, instructor, etc. it is necessary to file such a complaint in writing. Any complaints that might be filed will be kept confidential. An investigation into the complaint will be conducted and disciplinary measures will be taken accordingly.

PREVIOUS CREDIT TRANSFER

Because the art of taxidermy allows for a wide variety of techniques, it is the goal of Trails End School of Taxidermy to offer an opportunity for its students to complete the course with the skills needed to advance in the field. Due to the way the course is structured, however, any previous credits or training are non-transferable.

ENROLLMENT

Class size is limited to eight students per session. Applications for enrollment will be accepted any time prior to the first day of class. If the session preferred is filled, notice will be given and the applicant will be put on a waiting list for that session should anyone cancel their enrollment. If no openings come available the applicant may choose to enroll in another session or receive a refund of their deposit. Early registration is strongly recommended.

To register, please complete the application and return to Trails End School of Taxidermy with a deposit of \$1,000.00. This deposit will be applied, in its entirety, to the tuition cost. Half of the remaining tuition is due (1) one month prior to the start of class, or with registration if received less than (1) one month prior to the start of class. The remaining tuition is due the first day of class. All of the supplies needed throughout the session are provided by Trails End School of Taxidermy.

TUITION

The \$5,500.00 cost of tuition includes: a (1) year membership to the taxidermy association of choice, a (1) year subscription to "BREAKTHROUGH" magazine, one of the premier magazines in taxidermy, and the specimens needed to complete the course along with the forms that each specimen will be mounted on. All of the tools needed throughout the class are provided by Trails End School of Taxidermy. These supplies are not, however, the students property to take with them upon completion of class.

The only materials that students need to supply are: a pencil, notebook, and a video camera (this is not required, but is STRONGLY suggested).

BUYER'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

Each student will be notified of acceptance/rejection in writing. In the event a student is rejected, all tuition, fees and other charges will be refunded.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, if a student gives written notice of cancellation within five business days of the execution of the contract or day on which the student is accepted, **then a complete refund is given regardless whether the program has started.**

If a student gives written notice of cancellation after five business days of the execution of the contract or day on which the student is accepted, but before start of program by the school, **then all tuition, fees and other charges, except 15 percent of the total cost of the program (15 percent not to exceed \$50.00) shall be refunded to the student.**

If a student gives written notice of cancellation after the start of the period of instruction for which the student has been charged, but before completion of 75 percent of the period of instruction, **then the student is assessed pro rata portion of tuition, fees, and all other charges based on the number of days in the term plus 25 percent of the total program cost (25 percent not to exceed \$100.00).**

Any notice of cancellation shall be acknowledged in writing within 10 business days of receipt of such notice and all refunds shall be forwarded to the student within 30 business days of receipt of such notice.

This refund policy is not linked to any student conduct policy and any promissory instrument shall not be negotiated prior to the completion of 50 percent of the course.

Written notice of cancellation shall take place on the date the letter of cancellation is postmarked or, in the case where the notice is hand carried, it shall occur on the date the notice is delivered to the school. The date of execution of the enrollment agreement shall be presumed to the date of delivery of the notice of acceptance: and if delivered by mail, the postmark date of the letter of acceptance.

Game head

40 hours are devoted to deer taxidermy. Students will flesh and mount two game head mounts. The following procedures will be covered:

- Anatomy
- Measurements and form selection
- Hide preparation for tanning, including turning of the ears, and splitting the eyes, nose, and lips.
- Placement of antlers/horns on form
- Setting eyes
- Form alteration
- Repair of damage/holes to hide
- Mounting on form
- Final preparation/grooming
- Painting with an airbrush

Bear

20 hours will be devoted to bear taxidermy. Students will flesh and mount 1 open-mouth black bear. The open-mouth pose will give students the experience needed for doing other open-mouth specimens. The following procedures will be covered:

- Anatomy
- Measurements and form selection
- Hide preparation for tanning, including turning of the ears, and splitting the eyes, nose, and lips
- Setting eyes
- Repair of damage/holes to hide
- Mounting on form
- Final preparation/grooming
- Painting with an airbrush

Fish

90 hours will be devoted to fish taxidermy. Students will skin and mount 6 wall-mount fish (one of which will be positioned on a scenery base), as well as develop the skills necessary for completing pedestal mounts. The

following procedures will be covered:

- Anatomy
- Drawing patterns for carving body
- Skinning and fleshing
- Preserving
- Mounting/casting heads
- Setting eyes
- Carding fins
- Correct use of epoxy
- Finish work
- Painting using an airbrush
- Positioning on a base/habitat

Small Mammal

20 hours will be devoted to life-size taxidermy. Each student will skin, flesh, and mount a small mammal. This mount will then be placed on a scenery base. The following procedures will be covered:

- Anatomy
- Measurement and form selection
- Skinning and hide preparation for tannery, including turning of the ears, and splitting the eyes, nose, and lips
- Setting eyes
- Repair of damage/holes to hide
- Mounting on form
- Final preparation/grooming
- Painting using an airbrush
- Positioning on base/habitat

Basic Business Operations

10 hours will be spent covering basic business functions. Each student will be given basic instruction in business operations. With a general understanding of day to day operations, students will leave knowing what to expect if they decide to turn their hobby into something more. The

following items will be covered:

- Basic bookkeeping skills
- Pricing mounts
- Customer service
- Licensing
- Advertising
- Controlling overhead expenses
- Collections

Habitats

25 hours will be spent creating habitat bases. The three types of habitats that will be completed are: underwater, pond setting, and field setting. Each base will then be incorporated into one of the mounts.

Discussion/Demonstration

10 hours will be spent discussing Taxidermy and the law. Getting licensed by the DNR and USFW, as well as a general overview of the field. Each student will leave with a subscription to Breakthrough magazine, one of the premier magazines in taxidermy. You will also get a one year membership to a Taxidermy Guild or Association of your choice. Demonstrations on the various techniques will be performed allowing students the opportunity to video-tape the procedures so that they will have information readily available to them at the completion of the course for reference. A demonstration will be given on each specimen that the student will be completing throughout the course. (45 hours). 5 hours will be spent touring the tannery and viewing demonstrations.

Upon satisfactory completion of the entire taxidermy course, 300 hours of class time, each student will receive a certificate of completion.

GRADING POLICY

It is the policy of Trails End School of Taxidermy to provide its students with a non-competitive atmosphere. The course is set up on the pass/fail system. Each student's progress is assessed by the individual instructors. The instructors will, upon completion, evaluate each piece and provide

the students with a critique. Because each student will progress at different rates, these critiques will enable the students to improve upon the areas that are needed. At Trails End School of Taxidermy we feel that any student who makes an effort should be able to leave the class with a certificate of completion. This certificate shows that the student has been instructed in the areas necessary to advance in his/her taxidermy career. If any student chooses not to make an effort, that student will not receive a certificate. If, in the future, he/she should like to re-take the course they may do so. However, the full tuition amount will be charged.
